SLU wins fundraising effort among attorneys

Madison County attorneys raised more than \$23,000, money that will go to helping area residents attend law school. The money will be awarded to five law schools whose alumni participated in the competition this year, including Saint Louis University, University of Illinois, Southern Illinois University Carbondale, University of Missouri, and Washington University.

Saint Louis University won this year's friendly competition by raising \$11,069.

In all, alumni raised more than \$23,000 for the five schools, a record, according to Mary Nalefski, an original member of the Madison County Bar Association's Scholarship Committee.

"This organization should be very proud of our accomplishments, having raised in excess of \$220,000 since the campaign's beginning in 1995,

having established endowed scholarships at SLU and SIU-Carbondale, and being well on our way to establishing a third at the University of Illinois," said Nalefsky, a graduate of Saint Louis University School of Law.

At a ceremony recently at Tony's Restaurant in Alton, the MCBA presented an over-sized check for \$11,069 to SLU School of Law Dean Michael Wolff, Assistant Dean of Development and Alumni Relations Sheridan Haynes and others.

Wolff said that SLU School of Law admissions have increased from last year. The school, he said, is delighted to have the MCBA's support.

"Everybody's telling you 'Don't go to law school.' But we have a very energized, great group of people and we'll be there right-sized within a very short time," Wolff said.
